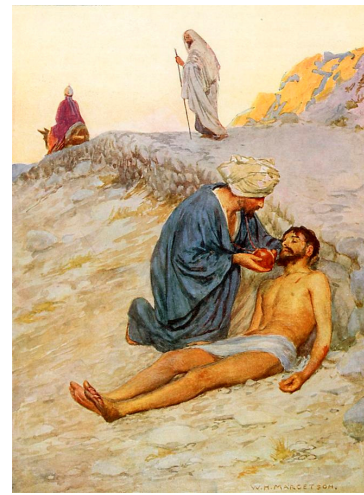

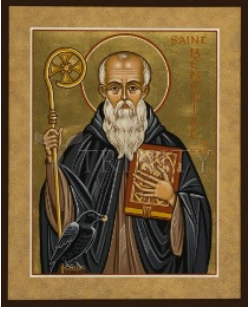

A stewardship parish is a welcoming parish regardless of the parish demographics: large or small - urban, suburban or rural.

## Saint in Focus: Benedict of Nursia



This Thursday (July 11<sup>th</sup>), the church celebrated the feast day of St. Benedict of Nursia, founder of the Benedictine order. St. Benedict was born in what is now Italy on March 2, 480. During the course of his life, he founded 12 communities of monks and wrote the *Rule of St. Benedict*. The *Rule* is comprised of 73 chapters detailing how members of a monastic community ought to behave towards one another and towards God. Rather than emphasizing strict, ruthless practices as were common at the time, Benedict espoused moderation and charity. Many of his sayings can be used today in our own lives. For instance, he wrote, “to whom more is entrusted, from him more is exacted.” As even the most casual fan of superheroes can attest, with great power comes great responsibility. Benedict understood this 1500 years ago and so expected much from the leaders of his communities. Today, there are hundreds of religious communities worldwide who live their entire lives by the *Rule of St. Benedict*.

If you are interested in learning more about the Benedictines and seeing two Benedictine communities firsthand, please pick up a permission slip in the back of the church, fill it out, and turn it in by **Friday, July 19**. On **Wednesday, July 24**, we will be taking a trip to visit the Sisters of St. Benedict in Ferdinand, Indiana, followed by a trip to the Benedictine Monastery of St. Meinrad (where our own Jayke White will be leading a short tour). Fifth-Twelfth grade students are welcome to attend and anyone older is encouraged to participate as an adult chaperone. Call the parish office with any questions!
